The Governing Body's main purpose is to help raise education standards at John Scurr Primary by working alongside and supporting John Scurr's school leaders. We ensure that the school runs effectively, that quality teaching and learning is happening across the school, and that the budget is spent wisely so that the school provides good value for money.

Training and development for staff is something we take very seriously at John Scurr. In 2022/2023:

All teachers took part in Unity training days together.

All Teachers took part in many hours of in-school Phonics training.

New teachers took part in an extra 39 hours of training on top of this!

Teaching assistants took part in 30 hours of in-school training.

We also sent staff on many training courses!

Parents were busy learning too, and took part in different courses at school including online e-safety and healthy eating workshops.

Governors need to learn too, so we had training on understanding Ofsted and safeguarding.



School Improvement Priorities 2022-23
